Jos. F. Ames's Will, dated Oct. 12, 1850, admitted
to record Nov. 25, 1850.

"After the payment of my just debts I wish my property
both real & personal to be equally divided between my two
children Oswell W. Ames, and Sarah A. Ames, to share and
share alike, but in case either should die before lawful
age and leaving no heir, in that event the other shall
have that portion heretofore given, and in case both of my
children should die before lawful age, and leaving no heir
or heirs, in that event I lend the whole of my estate to my
wife Nancy B. Ames during her life, or widowhood, And
in case of her marriage or death I direct that my estate
should be equally divided between David Mearns' Children,
that he may have by my sister Juliet Mearns, Edward W.
Ames' children, and Elijah W. Nock's children, each to
share and share alike."

Mrs. Ames renounced this will -

Nancy B. Joyne Will - [She was the widow of Jos. F. Ames.]
dated July 28, 1870, admitted to record Dec. 26, 1870.

"I give to my husband Mrs. R. Joyne all of my
interest in the farm where I reside, and known as the Jos.
F. Ames land, - on condition benevole praveant, &c.
Mrs. Joyne had no power to make a will.

David Mearns married Jos. F. Ames' sister Juliet.
Edward W. Ames was Jos. F. Ames' brother. Jos. died first.
Elijah W. Nock was Mrs. Nancy B. Ames' brother.

Sarah A. F. Ames married S. J. Burlington Nov. 20, 1866.
Marriage License of Mrs. R. Joyne, Jr. & Nancy B. Ames was issued
Decr 29, 1851.
