

This deed, made this 18th day of April,
A.D. 1875, between John Nuly, Special Commissioner,
of the one part, and Upshur B. Quincy, of the
other part, both of the county of Accomac, and
state of Virginia: — Whereas, on the 15th day
of November, A.D. 1873, it was decreed and ordered
by the Circuit Court for the said county, in a
certain suit in chancery depending then and
now in said court, between Isaac Wheaton, of
William, who sues, &c. plaintiff, and Edward
K. Inead and others, defendants, that the said
John Nuly, Special Commissioner appointed by
the said decree, should at public auction, at
Onancock, upon the terms prescribed by the said
decree, make sale of the real estate of the defendant
Elizabeth D. Inead, described in the proceedings
of said suit, having first advertised the time,
terms and place of sale by giving twenty days
previous notice by advertisements posted at the
front-door of the Court House of said county and
at three or more public places in the vicinity of
the premises. And whereas, by the said decree
the said Special Commissioner was authorized
to dispose of the said real estate in gross or in
parcels, and for the purpose of dividing the same
into lots, should he deem it best for the interests
of all concerned to sell the said real estate in
that manner, he was authorized also to employ
the services of a competent surveyor. And whereas,
