Richardson paid in cash on the day of sale One Hundred Dollars, and executed his three separate bonds, for an equal amount each, for the balance of his purchase-money, as required by the said decree; — And whereas, the said sale having been reported by the said commissioners to the said court, the same was ratified and confirmed by a decadal order entered in said suit on the 9th day of October, A.D. 1876; — And whereas, on the 8th day of June, A.D. 1877, it was decreed and ordered in said suit, by the said court, that Henry C.
