

## Abstract of Title to Duer Land.

About 1800 to 1810 John Addison owned the land. The land was sold after John Addison's death, about 1810, for partition amongst his heirs or for some other purpose, at which sale Peggy Savage, the widow of Abel Savage, dec'd., became the purchaser. Nathaniel Savage inherited it from Peggy Savage, his mother, he being the only child. Nathaniel Savage married Lacy Stringer, and died leaving a will under which his widow Lacy, by the death of all his <sup>who died unmarried, unmarried & without issue,</sup> children, claimed & held the land in fee; Lacy (Stringer) Savage married Rosemias Cropper, her second husband, & they had Sarah A. Cropper, who afterwards married Joshua R. Duer.

Benj. Stringer laid claim to the land, & he and Joshua Duer settled the matter by writings between them, by which Duer, or his wife rather, got the land. There was probably a suit about it & the terms of settlement are probably of record.
