W. Leato and Elizabeth Susan, his wife, George W. Leato, John C. Mapp and Margaret B., his wife, Walter G. Fentress and Ida S., his wife, Alfred Browne Leato and Virginia S., his wife, and Thomas G. Pitts and Marion C., his wife, do grant unto the said Georgie G. Quinley, wife of Upsher B.
